

Policy for Collective Worship

1. INTRODUCTION

Collective worship will provide children of all faiths or none with a spiritual, moral, social and cultural experience to prepare them for the opportunities, responsibilities and experiences of life.

2. AIMS

1. To provide an opportunity for collective worship.
2. To experience what is involved in the recognition of God or another supreme being.
3. To reflect on and share thoughts, feelings and expressions which arise from individual and group experiences.
4. To create an atmosphere of calm which promotes thoughtfulness and reflection.
5. To enable pupils to identify and reflect on shared values and moral and ethical standards.
6. To contribute to the development of individual beliefs and values and tolerance (through knowledge) of the beliefs and customs of others. **DIFFERENT IS GOOD.**
7. To develop a community spirit and the habit of making a positive contribution.
8. To encourage and mark achievement and the significant events in pupils' lives and the life of the school community.
9. To expand the appreciation of common human values and apply these in a local and global context.
10. To promote a "be healthy and stay safe" lifestyle.

11. To create a whole school experience where **Think!** and **YOU CHOOSE** can be embedded into all aspects of spiritual, moral, social and cultural development and personal, social and health education and citizenship.
12. To deliver a significant part of the new holistic scheme PSHE(E)/SMSC/RE.
13. To promote British values particularly democracy, the rule of law, individual liberty, mutual respect and tolerance for those of different faiths and beliefs.
14. To provide an opportunity to further develop the learning dispositions of ambition, collaboration, curiosity, empathy, flexibility of mind, focus, good judgment, initiative, originality, persistence, resilience, reflection, risk taking and self assurance.
15. To ensure and enable an understanding of relationships and health education.

3. **DAILY ASSEMBLY**

Whole school assemblies are held as follows:

Monday 8:50-9:15

Thursday 9.00-9.30

Class based Reflection is held on Thursdays.

Each assembly will provide:

- a time for reflection
- a prayer
- stillness and quiet

4. **PLANNING**

Assemblies will be planned a term ahead in conjunction with the PSHE, SMSC and RE weekly planning and details will be provided to all teachers. (Appendix 1) Daily Assemblies will follow a common format (see Proforma Appendix 2) and all will include **Think!** and **YOU CHOOSE**. The theme will be reflected weekly in the Pupil Planners.

5. **EVERY CHILD A LEARNER**

(meeting the needs of all pupils to ensure success and challenge for all abilities and backgrounds)

All children of all ages, abilities and those with learning difficulties and disabilities will access the learning outcomes at their own level.

6. **EQUAL OPPORTUNITIES**

The content of all assemblies will be of an appropriate level for all children and they will be presented without prejudice, whatever the age, ability, sex or ethnic origin of the pupils.

Parents will be made aware (start of academic year letter to parents) of their rights to withdraw their children from collective worship.

This policy was reviewed and amended in September 2025.

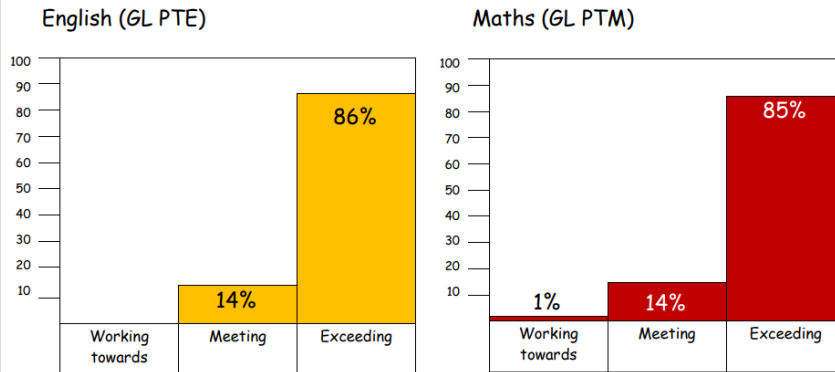

2023-2024

At the end of each academic year, children complete a national assessment in English and Maths. This is an external, age specific, written test which is marked externally by the assessing body GL Assessment. This is the whole school result for 2023-2024 for all classes from Form I to Upper IV. Children's results are described as Meeting (meeting the expected standard and for children of a particular age) or Exceeding (exceeding the standard).

SECURITY GATES

PARKING

If you have not yet read your Parent Information 2024-2025, these are the details to address what could be parking difficulties resulting from the construction of a car park at Calderdale Royal.

If you have not been to school since July you will be unaware of the much worsened parking situation. You may know that the Calderdale Royal Hospital has closed its car parking to construct a multi-storey car park. This could take up to two years.

The poor hospital staff are having to park wherever they can and many have chosen to park on Birdcage Lane! I am so sorry that we cannot be more helpful to them as they face a twice daily long walk to their cars.

We have asked the Local Authority to designate Birdcage Lane as a 30 minute parking zone, but that may take time. I have enclosed my email.

In the meanwhile, we have been very fortunate to secure drop off and collect parking at Southwood (the Masonic Lodge) on the left on Birdcage Lane. The Manager is a lovely past pupil and he has agreed morning and 3:45pm short stay parking.
